FAMOUS HISPANIC ARTISTS



Mexican artist Frida Kahlo produced some of the most recognizable paintings of the 20th century. Frida often paid tribute to her Mexican heritage by incorporating traditional symbols and pre-Colombian references into her work. She is known for her fierce personality, colorful Mexican clothing, and deeply personal artwork.

Joan Miro was a Catalan artist, and a driving force in the surrealist movement of the 1920s. In addition to painting, he created sculptures, ceramics, prints and set designs. He dedicated his later years to supporting young artists in Barcelona.



Jean-Michel Basquiat was a pivotal American artists of Haitian and Puerto Rican descent. He first became known as a graffiti artist before transitional into fine art. His groundbreaking style was often steeped in social commentary. His highly sought neo-expressionist work is displayed all over the world.



Jose Clemente Orozco was a muralist whose powerful work helped build unity after the Mexican Revolution.
